The files of the Passport Office, United States Department of State, reviewed by a representative of the Federal Bureau of Investigation on February 26, 1968, disclosed that DIANA OUGHTON was issued Passport Number B334237 on April 26, 1961, at Washington, D. C., for a fifteen-month stay in France, Germany, Switzerland, Austria, Italy, Sweden, Belgium and "all surrounding countries" and listed the purpose of her trip as "to be a student." In her application, dated April 22, 1961, before the Circuit Court, Pontiac, Illinois, she stated that she planned to leave from Chicago, Illinois on June 28, 1961, via Air France. This passport was valid for three years' travel to all countries except Albania, Cuba and those portions of China, Korea and Vietnam under communist control.

She stated that she was born on January 26, 1942, at Chicago, Illinois, and the file reflects that her birth certificate was seen by the passport authorities. Her permanent residence was 103 West South Street, Dwight, Illinois. Her parents were listed as JAMES HENRY OUGHTON, JR., born at Chicago, Illinois on May 14, 1914 and JANE PATTERSON OUGHTON, born at Chicago, Illinois on April 23, 1914. Both parents were residing at the above address. She stated that she was never married.

The file contains an application for registration as an American citizen made by DIANA OUGHTON at Munich, Germany on October 10, 1961. This registration was valid until April 25, 1964. She was then residing at "Muchen 23, Klementinenstrasse 14." On April 7, 1964, at Guatemala, she again registered as an American citizen and also renewed the above passport, to be valid until April 25, 1966. 

The information furnished herewith concerns an individual who is believed to be covered by the agreement between the FBI and Secret Service concerning Presidential protection, and to fall within the category or categories checked.

4. U. S. citizens or residents who defect from the U. S. to countries in the Soviet or Chinese Communist blocs and return.
5. Subversives, ultrarightists, racists and fascists who meet one or more of the following criteria:
 - (a) Evidence of emotional instability (including unstable residence and employment record) or irrational or suicidal behavior;
 - (b) Expressions of strong or violent anti-U. S. sentiment;
 - (c) Prior acts (including arrests or convictions) or conduct or statements indicating a propensity for violence and antipathy toward good order and government.
6. Individuals involved in illegal bombing or illegal bomb-making.

STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

The Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, in June, 1962. The SDS is an association of young people on the left and has a current program of protesting the draft, promoting a campaign for youth to develop a conscientious objector status, denouncing United States intervention in the war in Vietnam, and to "radically transform" the university community, and provide for its complete control by students. GUS HALL, General Secretary, Communist Party, USA, when interviewed by a representative of United Press International in San Francisco, California, on May 14, 1965, described the SDS as a part of the "responsible left" which the Party has "going for us." At the June, 1965, SDS National Convention, an anti-communist proviso was removed from the SDS constitution. In the October 7, 1966, issue of "New Left Notes", the official publication of SDS, an SDS spokesman stated that there are some communists in SDS and they are welcome. The national headquarters of this organization as of July 24, 1968, was located in Room 206, 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois.

Body Discovered in Rubble Identified

Chicago Daily News Service

The decapitated body of a young woman found in the wreckage of a New York townhouse destroyed by dynamite explosions has been identified as the daughter of a prominent Illinois businessman and politician. New York police yesterday identified the body — one of three found in the rubble of what authorities described as a "bomb factory" for radicals — as Diana Oughton, 28.

Miss Oughton is the daughter of James H. Oughton Jr., 55, of Dwight, Ill. — member of a

wealthy family, bank executive, and successful Republican "blue ribbon" candidate for state representative in 1964.

New York authorities said Miss Oughton's body was identified 12 days after the explosion through an FBI fingerprint check of a single finger found in the debris.

The picture of Miss Oughton gathered from information across the country reveals a wealthy, socially concerned young woman who began by helping others and ended a violent revolutionary.

She was born in Dwight, a town of 3,000 about 37 miles southwest of Joliet.

Her father, who was persuaded to run for the State Legislature by U.S. Sen. Charles H. Percy, is vice president of Dwight's First National Bank (her uncle, Richard is president) and founder of the Chicago Committee on Alcoholism.

She attended high school at the Madeira School, a school for young women in Greenway, Va. near Washington and was gradu-

ated in 1963 from Bryn Mawr College in Bryn Mawr, Pa.

She spent two years teaching reading in Guatemala in an American Friends Service Committee program, then spent several years at the University of Michigan, receiving a master's degree in education.

While at Michigan she apparently became friendly with members of the Students for a Democratic Society.

Miss Oughton was among a group of 58 persons arrested in Chicago in October when SDS members went on a rampage.

The "New York Times" a daily newspaper of general circulation, published at New York, New York, printed an article on page 34 of its City Edition on March 19, 1970, which was captioned "Life of Bomb Victim Is Traced."

This article in part reports that Diana Oughton, age 23, died in an explosion of what the police said was a revolutionaries' bomb factory in Greenwich Village, twelve days ago.

On March 16, 1970, a right little finger was located at the site of the bombing, 18 West 11th Street, New York, New York.

On March 17, 1970, a fingerprint lifted from the right little finger uncovered on March 16, 1970, was transmitted to the Identification Division of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI).

On March 17, 1970, the Identification Division of the FBI identified the fingerprint from the right little finger as that of Diana Oughton.

This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

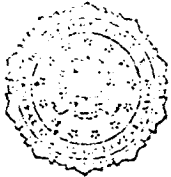

STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

A source has advised that the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as presently regarded, came into being at a founding convention held June, 1962, at Port Huron, Michigan. From an initial posture of "participatory democracy" the line of the national leadership has revealed a growing Marxist-Leninist adherence which currently calls for the building of a revolutionary youth movement. Concurrently, the program of SDS has evolved from civil rights struggles to an anti-Vietnam war stance to an advocacy of a militant anti-imperialist position. China, Vietnam and Cuba are regarded as the leaders of worldwide struggles against United States imperialism whereas the Soviet Union is held to be revisionist and also imperialist.

At the June, 1969, SDS National Convention, Progressive Labor Party (PLP) forces in the organization were expelled. As a result, the National Office (NO) group maintained its National Headquarters at 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, and the PLP faction set up headquarters in Cambridge, Massachusetts. This headquarters subsequently moved to Boston. Each group elected its own national officers, which include three national secretaries and a National Interim Committee of eight. Both the NO forces and the PLP forces claim to be the true SDS. Both groups also print their versions of "New Left Notes" which sets forth the line and the program of the particular faction. The NO version of "New Left Notes" was recently printed under the title "The Fire Next Time" to achieve a broader mass appeal.

Two major factions have developed internally within the NO group, namely, the Weatherman or Revolutionary Youth Movement (RYM) I faction, and the RYM II faction. Weatherman is action-oriented upholding CASTRO's position that the duty of revolutionaries is to make revolution. Weatherman is regarded by RYM II as an adventurist, elitist faction which denies the historical role of the working class as the base

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for revolution. RYM II maintains that revolution, although desired, is not possible under present conditions, hence emphasizes organizing and raising the political consciousness of the working class upon whom they feel successful revolution depends. Although disclaiming control and domination by the Communist Party, USA, leaders in these two factions have in the past proclaimed themselves to be communists and to follow the precepts of a Marxist-Leninist philosophy, along pro-Chinese communist lines.

A second source has advised that the PLP faction which is more commonly known as the Worker Student Alliance is dominated and controlled by members of the PLP, who are required to identify themselves with the pro-Chinese Marxist-Leninist philosophy of the PLP. They advocate that an alliance between workers and students is vital to the bringing about of a revolution in the United States.

SDS regions and university and college chapters, although operating under the outlines of the SDS National Constitution, are autonomous in nature and free to carry out independent policy reflective of local conditions. Because of this autonomy internal struggles reflecting the major factional interests of SDS have occurred at the chapter level since the beginning of the 1969-70 school year.

A characterization of the PLP is attached.

PROGRESSIVE LABOR PARTY (PLP)

"The New York Times" city edition, Tuesday, April 20, 1965, page 27, reported that a new party of "revolutionary socialism" was formally founded on April 18, 1965, under the name of the PLP which had been known as the Progressive Labor Movement.

According to the article, "The Progressive Labor Movement was founded in 1962, by MILTON ROSEN and MORTIMER SCHNER after they were expelled from the Communist Party of the United States for assertedly following the Chinese Communist line."

A source advised on June 3, 1968, that the PLP held its Second National Convention in New York City, May 31 to June 2, 1968, at which time the PLP reasserted its objective of the establishment of a militant working class movement based on Marxism-Leninism. This is to be accomplished through the Party's over-all revolutionary strategy of raising the consciousness of the people and helping to provide ideological leadership in the working class struggle for state power.

The source also advised that at the Second National Convention MILTON ROSEN was unanimously re-elected National Chairman of the PLP and LEVI LAUR, FRED JEROME, JAMES ISHAKL, WILLIAM HETON, JACOB ROSEN, JEFFREY GORDON, and WALTER LYNBER were elected as the National Committee to lead the PLP until the next convention.

The PLP publishes "Progressive Labor," a bimonthly magazine; "World Revolution," a quarterly periodical; and "Challenge-Desafio," a monthly newspaper.

The April, 1969, issue of "Challenge-Desafio" sets forth that "Challenge is dedicated to the peoples fight for a new way of life--where the working men and women control their own homes and factories; where they themselves make up the entire government on every level and control the

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schools, courts, police and all institutions which are now used to control them."

Source advised on May 8, 1969, that the PLP utilizes an address of General Post Office Box 808, Brooklyn, New York, and also utilizes an office in Room 617, 1 Union Square West, New York, New York.

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
